



MERRIT WELCH '29 TO BE HONORED AT HOMECOMING

Merrit Welch Appreciation Day has been declared for October 4th by Delta Xi Chapter, the House Corporation, and the Educational Foundation to honor Merrit's outstanding record of loyalty and service to Delta Tau Delta.

Merrit Welch graduated in chemistry from UND in 1929, but there was no jobs available in chemistry so he signed on with Implement Dealers Mutual Insurance Company of Grand Forks. This started a successful insurance career, and more than 50 years of service to the Fraternity.

Merrit was involved in getting Beta Chi ready to be affiliated with Delta Tau Delta, recolonizing the chapter after WWII, was chapter advisor from 1946 to 1963, was a leader on the House Corporation from 1948 to 1975, established the building fund in 1956 that led to the building of the new chapter house, and has been a member of the Grand Forks and Central Arizona Alumni Chapters. Merrit has been a guiding influence for many a young Delt encouraging excellence and expecting strong chapter leadership and business management. Brother Welch has been faithful to Delt Ideals, and answered every call for assistance.

Merrit was a successful Insurance executive serving as President of Implement Dealers Insurance Co. from 1964 to 1979 and serving as chairman of the board from 1965 to 1984. He was a director for American Life and Casualty Co. of Fargo of which Harold Bangert '28 was president and chairman of the board. He was also director of the Statesman Insurance group of Des Moines, IA and American Liberty Insurance Co. of Birmingham, AL.

Merrit and his wife, Blanche, reside in Minot, North Dakota during the summer and 2252 N. 86th St. in Mesa, Arizona 85201 during the winters. Please join us at Homecoming in showing our appreciation for his dedicated service and loyalty to Delta Tau Delta.

BROTHER DELT BRINGS NEW LIFE TO DEPOT

When architect Cass Gilbert designed the Great Northern Railway depot that was built along DeMers Avenue in 1891, the \$100,000 price tag was believed to be the highest of any depot in the midwest.


And when architect William Schoen, '74 Delt and member of House Corporation, of Schoen Associates and two partners finish restoring The Depot, the \$500,000 investment will put a new shine on a tarnished piece of Grand Forks history.

The reconstruction, which began last year by gutting most of the interior, produced some surprises. Among them was the discovery that the building had no insulation, according to Schoen. He also learned that the railroad had offices in the attic, where there was no natural light.

Schoen said the project hasn't turned him into a history fanatic. But he recently was appointed to the city's Historic Preservation Committee.

"I guess the more you get to know about it," he said, "you do get hooked."

The North Dakota Broadcasters Association, with a pledge of \$5,000 has established the Charles Burke Broadcasting Scholarship Endowment within the University of North Dakota Foundation. Charles Burke, a 1925 and 1942 graduate, was the owner of the KFGO Radio in Fargo, North Dakota. He died in 1959. He was very involved with Beta Chi and Delta Tau Delta over the years.

A \$500 scholarship will be awarded each year to a sophomore, junior or a senior student majoring in broadcasting. Recipients must be in good scholastic standing with a minimum GPA of 2.0, plan to pursue a career in radio and television and show a need for financial assistance.

UND FLYING TEAM DEFENDS NATIONAL TITLE

They did it! The UND Flying Team brought home the gold to UND for the second year in a row! They won by a winning margin of 40 points at the National Intercollegiate Flying Association's 38th Annual Tournament of Champions in Waco, Texas.

The victory was sweet indeed with UND also winning — for the third year in a row — the judge's trophy for best overall team. Up until last year, no school in the tournament's history had ever won both top prizes. The team's coach, Kent Lovelace, was recognized as Outstanding Coach of the Year.

Delts on the team are **Robert Breckner** (assistant coach); **Robert Geisler** and **Will Ward** (co-captain).

Geisler was one of four graduating aviation students nationwide to win the new and much-coveted Beechcraft scholarship. The scholarship — worth about \$6,000 — entitles Geisler to participate in the King Air turboprop course at the new multi-million dollar Beechcraft Training Center in Wichita, Kansas. There, he will train on state-of-the-art interactive video systems, cockpit procedures trainers, and full-motion simulators.

Geisler was one of ten finalists from across the nation selected by the University Aviation Association Scholarship Committee and interviewed by Beech officials during the NIFA tournament. The four winners were announced at the awards banquet on Saturday, April 19. Congratulations, Rob!

Delta Xi Wins First-Ever Court Of Honor

Jim Deblock said he didn't know what to say when he heard the announcement.

"Our mouths just kind of dropped open," Deblock said, referring to Dave Ulmen, Scott Blood and himself — the delegates to the 1986 Northern Division convention — after Delta Xi won its first Court of Honor. The Court of Honor is the second-highest acolade that an undergraduate chapter of Delta Tau can receive.

Twenty-five Court of Honor awards were given this year. Criteria for the award is based on campus and city involvement of members, scholarship, and overall achievement in the opinion of the national chapter.

The 1986 award is a reflection of the spring and fall semesters of 1985, in which Delta Xi celebrated its 50th anniversary on the UND Campus.

The Court of Honor cannot be won without contributions from the entire chapter, alumni as well as undergraduate, but much of the credit for the award should go to Bob Henkes, who spent hours compiling a very complete report to the national office along with his dedicated leadership and effort.
