For only the second time in its history, and the second straight year in a row, Delta Xi was recognized as a **Hugh Shields Chapter** at the Northern Divisional Conference in Columbus, Ohio.

The Hugh Shields Award is given annually by the International Fraternity to recognize excellence in all aspects of chapter programming. The award recognizes the top ten of Delta Tau Delta's 130 chapters. Delta Xi received a 1994 emblem to go on the Hugh Shields plaque that it received last year along with the ever impressive Hugh Shields Flag. The Flag models the purple, white, and gold flag of the fraternity. Written along the top is the Greek word π potiuoi, which translates to "First Among Equals."

Delta Xi also received their fourth consecutive Court of Honor, which recognizes the top 20 of Delta Tau Delta's 130 chapters. The Hugh Shields top ten designation was a result of hard work and dedication in areas such as

Spring semester 1995 began with a bang when the Chapter initiated 15 new men to active status on January 14th. Looking through the register this proves to be the largest initiate class for almost 20 years. It was great to see alumni at our initiation ceremony. Thank you to brothers Glenn Johnson, Arnold Johnson, Scotty Cranna, Bruce Gjovig, Don Toman, Aaron Karow, and Eric Gunderson! The new actives provided valuable input during our chapter retreat on January 10th. It was then that Delta Xi laid out our path to success. It includes goals for scholastic excellence, total financial integrity, increased chapter participation and an updated mission statement.

One recent accomplishment has been in the strive for chapter academic improvement. Fall 1994 ended with Delta Xi ranked 3 out of 13 Fraternities in overall cumulative GPA. Excellent job brothers! That is one huge step closer to being #1.

Everyone at 2700 University has had their hands full since the beginning of 1995. There were 21 undergraduate members attending Delta Xi's Local Leadership Academy Feb. 4th and 5th. This was an invaluable opportunity for them to groom personal leadership skills and to do a bit of self-evaluation. Much thanks to John Hancock, Merlin Dewing, Vicki Poels, and Bob Muhs for providing this experience to the undergraduate chapter.

The weekend following Leadership Academy was the International Fraternity's Northern Division Conference at Ohio State. Twenty Delts made the trek from Grand Forks to Columbus in search of our second consecutive Hugh Shield Award. Delta Xi was once again honored as one of Delta Tau Delta's top 10 chapters!

After the success of last semester's Haunted House, Delta Xi is once again turning its eyes to philanthropy. The focus is being placed on Delta Tau Delta's international philanthropy, Adopt-A-School, and the second annual Deltona Beach Volleyball Tournament. Adopt-A-School is designed to assist elementary school children within the Grand Forks Community and the volleyball tournament proceeds will be donated to the Prairie Harvest Foundation. (Establishment for the mentally and emotionally handicapped in Grand Forks)

The new executive committee has had its share of tasks as well. The brand new Delta Tau Delta Annual Achievement Agreement has provided a challenge for all. This document is designed to assist chapters in planning and goal setting on a semesterly basis. It encompasses these six areas: Academic Excellence, Chapter Financial Excellence, Membership Excellence, Excellence in Alumni Relations/Delt 2000, Excellence in External Operations and Excellence in Internal Operations. This is the Fraternity's way of assessing and "accrediting" individual chapters of Delta Tau Delta. Delta Xi, in the tradition of being the first and the best, is working hard to meet the 40 criteria and become one of the first chapters to receive accreditation by May 1995!

James Wallen, chapter consultant, spent Jan. 14-18 in Grand Forks. Everyone benefited from his insight and advice. He stressed financial integrity within the chapter, participation, rush and retention. While his visit was enjoyable and educational, James shared a new concept with

the chapter called "value based decision making" which this year's exec will be stressing. Thank you James.

All of the brothers of Delta Xi would like to extend a warm welcome to our new housemother, Carmen Toman! Carmen accepted the position on January 28th and everyone is looking forward to seeing a lot more of her around the Shelter.

Another new face at the University of North Dakota is Carmen Ahlers, the new Coordinator of Greek Life. She is an energetic, experienced lady who is here to help the greek system. The Delts are looking forward to actually *working with* the office of greek life for a change.

As can be seen, 1995 does seem to have quite a bit in store for Delta Xi and everyone is excited to make it happen. I would like to extend a personal invitation to **all** Delt alumni to visit the chapter at anytime and see for yourself the success we are having! I look forward to seeing many of you on March 4th at our formal banquet.



Delt Edge Job Search Program

In the search for helping our Delt graduates find the best possible job, Delta Xi chapter served as a pilot site for a new job search program called the Delt Edge. The Delt Edge is a two-day, 16hour, program covering resumes, cover letters, interview preparation, and the interview process, networking, and job search strategies. Included in the process was mock interviews.

Our Delta Tau Delta Education Foundation sponsored the pilot program on November 5-6, 1994. Ten Delts attending were: Dave Sickles, Doug Birkmaier, Ron Denny, Nick Tomlin, Dave Dotson, Josh Sutton, Jason Alt, and Matt Oosting. Alumni volunteers assisting with mock interviews were Mark Thompson, Truman Reed, Mary Reed, and Bruce Gjovig. Instructor was Stan Telford, who was a chapter consultant for the fraternity, and is now a full time career counselor in Chicago. Over 500 students have gone through a similar program in Illinois.

Response from our first graduates were outstanding. One Delt had experienced other iob placement seminars, and felt strongly this was a far superior approach. Our Education Foundation invested \$140 per student in Delt Edge. The same seminar goes for \$400 per participant in Chicago. The national fraternity anticipates offering this program to all chapters in the near future to help graduating Delts to gain the skills needed to get the best job possible upon graduation. Delta Xi is pleased to serve as the test sight to evaluate this innovative and important job service program.
