




Joel Medd Elected to Chair ABA's State Trial Judges

Joel D. Medd, Delta Xi '69, District Judge of Grand Forks was elected Chair of the National Conference of State Trial Judges of the American Bar Association at the Associations's annual meeting August 3, 2001 in Chicago, Illinois.

He is the first judge from North Dakota to hold this position. He succeeds Judge Leslie Miller from Tucson, AZ. The approximately 1300 member National Conference of State Trial Judges works to improve the quality of justice.

Judge Medd has been active in the American Bar Association since 1976. He has chaired the Publications Committee for the past several



years and has also served on the Membership Committee, Bylaws Committee, and Jury Standards Committee. Judge Medd served as a District Representative representing Minnesota, Montana, North Dakota and South Dakota from 1995 until 1998.

Judge Medd serves as the North Dakota Delegate to the Conference representing the District Judges of North Dakota. He served as the Benson County Judge from 1975 until 1979, also serving briefly as the Williams County Judge in Williston and as the Towner County Justice in Cando. He has also served as a Tribal Appeals Judge at Belcourt as well as a

as a Municipal Judge. Governor Art Link appointed him as a District Judge in Grand Forks in 1979 and he has been elected to that position several times.

At the ABA annual State Trial Judges meeting Medd stated " My goal is provide a way to spread the knowledge of thousands of state trial judges through better use of the internet and programs. Our conference for example has been instrumental in developing Drug Court Standards and Discovery Guidelines to assist other courts in these areas.

Many of our judges have developed outstanding programs involving community involvement which can be shared with other judges."

The American Bar Association is the largest voluntary professional association in the world. with more than 400,000 members. The ABA provides law school accreditation, continuing legal education, information about the law, programs to assist lawyers and judges in their work, and initiatives to improve the legal system for the public.

Fall semester has been a busy one for technology. Here are some of the highlights:

In early October, we successfully finished the installation and implementation of an ethernet network in the shelter.

We currently have Qwest DSL Internet service running to every member's room, the library, living room, basement and computer lab. This was all done with money allocated by House Corp. Spring 2001.

In late October, Education Foundation approved \$5000 for the purchase of new equipment for the computer lab from the 2000-2001 technology budget. Also an additional \$2500 was approved for the current semester.

Here's a quick list of what we purchased;(2) Dell Dimension 4300 Desktops, (1) Apple iMac, (1) Hewlett Packard 4100N laser printer and various software upgrades.



Needed Repairs Done to Shelter

Through a bequest of Vince Reuter '41 of San Diego the House Corporation was able to authorize several needed repairs, improvements and upgrades to the Chapter House at 2700 University Avenue.

These improvements should help the Chapter stay competitive on campus and within Delta Tau Delta.

Items authorized include new rain gutters and down spouts, fire alarms and exit lighting, carpeting, gas fireplace for living room, and to fix the persistent cold problems in the back hallway.

Some of the items were mandated by the fire marshal and they included magnetic door openers and panic openers for doors.

On the improvement side is the DSL wiring for high speed computer access. This is necessary to keep pace with computer technology and outside access.

A Maintenance Committee composed of members of the Executive Committee and Chapter Members met about a half a dozen times to review proposals and prioritize needs.

The bequest was for about \$61,000 and it is hoped that a sizable portion will be used to pay off existing loans to the Educational Foundation and to set aside money for future needs.

Alumni working on the Maintenance Committee included Chapter Advisor Tom Hanson, House Corporation Pres. Joel Medd, V.P. Ken Johnson, Secretary David Carroll, Treasurer Ken McGregor, Bruce Gjovig, Neil Fleming, Harold Gustafson, Chapter Members House_ and Grounds Chair Kirk Mercille, President Pat Stevens and many others at various times.

This was the most active alumni-undergraduate committee in years and did a great job and it deserves the thanks of all for a job well done.

After working with Italian government officials and the American Embassy he was able to move to the United States. He first lived in Arizona and then ended up in Grand Forks, North Dakota. He is married to Elena, who also came to America from Romania, but at a younger age of 14. Both parents are working jobs to help make the ends meet. Neither parents were able to attend college

and because of that have had their share of problems with getting a good paying job.

This past December 14, 2001, the men of Delta Xi pooled their time and treasure together to deliver this miracle. A group of men gathered at the Almasan residence to deliver gifts and goodies while the children were at school. And like jolly old Saint Nick, we were up the chimney, or out the front door, before the children showed up.

Bob Feidler '71 is yet another member of our wonderful alumni who are actively working for the benefit of Delta Xi. After graduating from law school in 1974, Bob spent the next twenty-five years in the Washington D.C. area.

He was a senior counsel with the U.S. Senate, held executive positions with the Federal Judiciary, and engaged in international consulting before returning to North Dakota in 2000.

Bob served as executive director of the UND Alumni Association and Foundation before leaving earlier this year to return to international work.

Bob was elected to the board of the Delt Education Foundation last Fall and has been working with Bruce Gjovig on issues related to fundraising. He also heads up an effort to substantially augment our chapter library by obtaining major books on leadership as well as other classics of both fiction and nonfiction. The goal is fifty new books by February 1.

In addition, Bob has a primary role in the development of the 2002 version of the Delt Leadership Academy which will be held at the end of January.

His most recent overseas work has been in central Asia where he leads a U.S. Agency for International Development project designed to modernize the insolvency laws and infrastructure of Armenia. A new court system is in place, a new is scheduled to be adopted by late Spring, and training for the judges, attorneys, accountants, trustees and others will take place throughout the spring. While continuing his international work, Bob is also working on other ideas to enhance opportunities and awareness for North Dakotans in the international sphere.

Bob is a recipient of the Delta Tau Delta Alumni Achievement Award. His son, Bill, a sophomore at UND, and an active member of delt.




